From your Rector ~ The Rev. Susan Scranton



Walk in love as Christ loved us and gave himself for us, an offering and sacrifice to God.

A little more than a year ago, much of the world was mesmerized by the words of our Presiding Bishop Michael Curry, as he gave the sermon at the Royal Wedding of Prince Harry and Meghan Markle.

Sticking to the theme of his work as Presiding Bishop, Curry's sermon proclaimed the power of love and its redemptive role to change the world. Out of that very sermon came books and programs detailing the power of love. Curry, himself, then set out to find a way to help people deepen their relationship of love with God, or as he proclaimed, "find a way to help people throw themselves into the arms of Jesus."

Meeting with a group of clergy and laity, Curry and the group discovered that the Church did not need a new program but instead should call upon the spiritual practices used for centuries. Monasteries and other houses of intentional spiritual development adopted what was known as a "Rule of Life," otherwise known as an intentional commitment to a set of practices that provide guidance, rhythm, and inspiration for living a beautiful, meaningful, and holy life. According to Curry, "The Way of Love: Practices for Jesus-Centered Life outlines a Rule for the Episcopal branch of the Jesus Movement to help church members grow more deeply with Jesus Christ at the center of our lives, so we can bear witness to his love in and for the world."

According to Curry, *The Way of Love* was designed to be spare and spacious, flexible enough that individuals, groups, and congregations can use it in a multitude of ways. Your Stewardship Committee has created a sermon series and program entitled "Walking the Way of Love," using the seven practices of **Turn — Learn — Pray — Worship — Bless — Go — Rest** to highlight our 2020 Stewardship Campaign, reminding us that all of life, including our spiritual development, is a gift of God meant to be nurtured and shared.

Beginning on September 8 and continuing through October 20, each Sunday will feature a sermon focused on one of the seven practices that invite us deeper into a relationship with Jesus. The following Sundays will include a sermon on the spiritual discipline of generous giving, a visit from Assisting Bishop Samuel Azariah on All Saints Sunday, and a party to celebrate Ingathering Sunday on November 10.

Echoing the words of Presiding Bishop Curry, I pray that we will grow as a community following the loving, liberating, life-giving way of Jesus, whose love has the power to change our lives and that of the world.


September 11 ~ 9:15 AM - 10 AM: Grace Chair Yoga Classes

African Team Ministries to offer an Alternative Christmas on September 15 after the 10 AM service.

On Sunday, September 15, African Team Ministries will be selling East African craft goods, jewelry, and soapstone in Baxter Hall following the 10:00 AM service. Consider this an opportunity to do some early Christmas shopping or just an excuse for you to purchase beautiful wood crafts, jewelry, and soapstone for yourself.

African Team Ministries often present their goods at our own Diocesan Convention. This organization is a Christian ministry working as an intermediary between African and American churches. With help from Episcopal, Methodist, Presbyterian, Lutheran, and Anglican denominations, they provide funding for orphan and refugee relief missions and evangelism in East Africa.

Current ministries include:

- The care, health, & education of orphans
- Provision of jobs for unemployed woman as they make crafts, and are thereby enabled to care for their children & parents
- Resources for projects of refugee relief, health education, clergy & lay education, and building repairs as they occur.
- Family-sized drip irrigation systems which provide a controlled release of water for maize (a staple food) using only 5 buckets of water daily
- And most recently by sending a 40' container with 250,000 meals to Kenya, after the worst drought in 60 years caused a severe food crisis and left more than 3 million Kenyans facing malnutrition & starvation.

This year, in response to God's call upon us to share what we have with others – both our Blessing of the Animals, and more importantly, the Good News of God in Jesus Christ – we are taking our 10:00 AM service to Finkbiner Park.

In this popular local setting, we are hoping to bring the love of God, through the unique gifts of Grace Episcopal Church, to the larger community.

You are encouraged to bring your pets and invite your friends to this special service. In an effort to make our service easily accessible to all people, we will be offering a special version of Morning Prayer, complete with beautiful psalms and canticles that praise God for creation and for our beloved animals. At the end of the service, each animal will be blessed, and following the service, guests will be treated to Grace hospitality with food and drink for both animals and humans. In concert with our efforts to reach out to those in need, we will be taking a special offertory of dog and cat food which will be given to local shelters.

Finkbiner Park offers us a lovely outdoor setting, complete with a shaded area, cement footing, and picnic tables. In addition, we will be bringing our own chairs and Blessing of the Animals altar to the park. Able bodied parishioners are encouraged to park in the Finkbiner parking lot or simply walk over church. A special shuttle service from church will offer door to door transportation for anyone, with or without pets, concerned about walking on the park grass. Those taking the church shuttle will be able to walk from the drop-off point to the church service site in 50 steps, all of which are on concrete.

Heard oral reports from the Rector and Wardens

Karen Cleland, Parish Treasurer, presented the Treasurer's report for July 2019, including the Income and Expense Sheet, Balance Sheet, General Ledger Fund Summary, and the Scrip Report. Karen also reported that the transfer of funds from Bank of America to America's Christian Credit Union will be completed by the end of August, with the closure of all Bank of America accounts. Finances are in good shape.

Audit 2018: Edie Noland and Tim Murphy are still working on our 2018 Audit. Results are pending and will be given to Vestry before September 1.

Addendum: On August 28, via email, Vestry approved the 2018 Audit.

Upcoming Events: Blessing of the Backpacks and Welcome Back Sundae — August 25; Ministry Fair and Chili Cook-off — September 8; Blessing of the Animals at Finkbiner Park — October 6; Bishop's Visit — November 3.

Buildings and Grounds: Todd Rice gave an update on all projects. He noted that the roof on the shed needs repair. A contract proposal from Ridgeline Roofing was presented for consideration. Vestry voted to sign the contract. A new Eagle Scout project by Adam Prinki of Troop 486 to clean up the east wall was approved by Vestry.

Boy Scout Troop 486: Rev. Susan reported on deepening contact with our Boy Scout Troop. The troop will assist with the transportation and set up of chairs and other items needed for the Blessing of the Animals. They also plan to partner with Grace Church in collecting food for the Holiday Basket Program. Scout Sunday is scheduled for Sunday, February 23, 2020, and the scouts will once again host our Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper on Tuesday, February 25, 2020.

Stewardship Report: Margo Keller, chair, reported that committee meetings have taken place during the summer. She also reported that Stewardship for 2020 will commence on September 8, using a program entitled "The Way of Love." Ingathering Sunday is set for Sunday, November 10, concluding with a festive party.

Newcomers and Growth: Nancy Rice reported that the Greeter's Group has begun working. Continued work includes updating the website. Adjournment and closing prayer.
