### From your Rector ~ The Rev. Susan Scranton



For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. (Jeremiah 29:11)

This passage from Jeremiah undoubtedly is my favorite Old Testament scripture reading. Written at a time of




Like last year, our goal for 2020 is to increase our pledge base, which means inviting more people to become a part of this wonderful community. Thank you again for your generosity in supporting our church.

## Joseph W. Thompson, **Boy Scout Troop 486** ~ Eagle Court of Honor

Congratulations to Joseph W. Thompson, the latest in a succession of nearly 70 Boy Scouts from Troop 486, for attaining the rank of Eagle Scout. For his Eagle project, Joseph worked with a wildlife biologist and other Forest Service personnel to build and install 4 four-chambered nursery-style bat boxes in the Angeles National Forest. Joseph led 33 adult and youth volunteers through a project that totaled nearly 470 work hours. This project was the fulfillment of a goal he first mentioned when he was a Cub Scout. In the process, he learned a tremendous amount about amazing, vastly underappreciated bats, knowledge that he is endeavoring to share with others.

In addition to his Eagle project, during his time as a Boy Scout, Joseph hiked over 960 miles, camped 144 nights, attended five weeklong summer camps, and volunteered more than 240 house of service in his community. It was my pleasure to offer an invocation and benediction at Joseph's award ceremony on Saturday, January 18.

# 2020 AMERICAN RED CROSS BLOOD DRIVE

The 2020 Blood Drive was a great success! We were able to recruit 32 donors by the morning of the drive. Roughly, 40% were non-parishioners. As with other drives, there were donors

who were sick and unable to donate, no-shows. However, we did have four walk-ins! Our collection goal was 27 units; we were able to collect 26!

The need is always critical, especially this time of year where regular donors are unable to donate due to illness. The need for blood could not be more urgent. Our Red Cross Representative told me that Queen of the Valley hospital has only 22 units in storage, 20 of which

have already been designated for scheduled surgeries.

Thank you to everyone who came out to support the Red Cross on Monday. Just by coming, with or without donating, you made a commitment to being a part of something great. It is so rewarding to know that we have individuals around us that are so willing to give the gift of life by donating blood!

Please remember that all parishioners are welcome to attend vestry meetings. Normally the vestry meets on the third Monday of the month at 7:00 PM. The meeting for December was held on December 16, 2019.

The December 2019 meeting opened with prayer.

Heard oral reports from the Rector and Wardens and received the minutes of the previous meeting.

- Treasurer's Report: Karen Cleland presented the November 2019 financial statements, including the Income and Expense sheet, Balance sheet, Fund Summary, and Scrip Income statement. Vestry authorized the treasurer to pay off the roof loan by the end of the year.
- Stewardship Report: Rev. Susan reported that to date we have received 63 pledges, including restricted pledges, totaling \$226,280. She noted that a potential 16 pledges missing.
- Outreach Report: A big thank you was offered to Debbie Pullen for her work in coordinating efforts to make Hillsides' Toy Collection, and to Tricia Coppack and Bobbi Patterson for their work. The Winter Homeless Shelter feeding is scheduled for Sunday, January 12, 2020 and the Blood Drive is scheduled for Monday, January 20, 2020.
- Buildings and Grounds: Todd Rice reported that the parking lot re-striping of the lines has been completed. He also noted that the company provided painting for a basketball court. Todd reported that extensive inspection and repair of the sprinkling system has been completed.
- Christmas Eve, the first Sunday after Christmas, and Year-End Considerations: Rev. Susan announced that there would be two services on Christmas Eve: 5:00 PM and 11:00 PM. Services on December 29 will feature Holy Communion at 8:00 AM and Christmas Lessons and Carols without communion at 10:00 AM. Sounds of Grace Handbell Choir will perform at Kid Space Museum on Sunday, December 29 at 1:00 PM.
