Minutes of the Annual Meeting of Grace Church, January 12, 1927:

After dinner, Mr. Downs (Sr. Warden) moved, second by Mr. Venberg, that we give a sincere vote of thanks to the ladies for the very good dinner. Carried unanimously. (Rev.) Mr. Wreford opened the meeting at 8:05. As a result of an informal vote, the men refrained from smoking.

Taken from minutes of a called meeting at the Foothill School, October 18, 1929:

(Rev.) Mr. Gould spoke on financial program and on holding a Men's Smoker. (Vestrymen were assigned to bring the following to the Smoker: coffee, sugar, cream, cake, cigarettes, sandwiches, ale, cigars, and pie.) The following to be invited: Messrs. Downes, Metcalf, Larry Spalding, Gould, Venberg, Bettin, Brunjes, E. Vanderslinn, Blackwood, Nasbickel, Ward, and Hanes. Alternate guests include Messrs. Frank Brown, Green, Blake, Weik, and Lawson.
